

This is a half day retreat that usually is held on a Saturday morning or Sunday evening but can be scheduled anytime that 3 ½ to 4 hours are available. It has been held as a church council retreat, a men's retreat and an event open to the entire congregation. We recommend that, if open to the entire congregation, churches also view this retreat as a community outreach event and publicize it in the community. There are two sessions with a break in between.

First Session: Seven Lessons for Living the Spiritual Life

Lay people expect the ordained clergy to live spiritual lives but do they realize the importance of a deep spirituality in their own lives? Our retreat leader shares lots of stories about his own spiritual journey, focusing on seven of the most important lessons he has learned about living a spiritual life. He also shares many crucial lessons learned from the Holy Scriptures and the writings of people such as St. Augustine, Martin Luther, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Thomas a Kempis, St. Teresa of Avila, John Stott and Mother Teresa.

Second Session: 10 Stops on the Road to Spiritual Transformation

This session is based on research and a book by George Barna, who is the foremost Christian researcher in America today. The session focuses on identifiable steps toward living a transformed life, as well as the ultimate goals: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." And: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

The value of this retreat is in opening lay people's hearts and minds to spiritual transformation in their own lives, identifying what may be hindering spiritual growth and transformation, and helping them understand that this transformation should be the goal of every Christian's life. The retreat will present lots of challenging material and there will be plenty of time for discussion. There is a PowerPoint presentation that accompanies the retreat.

<u>Cost:</u> Lutheran Lay Renewal currently does not charge a fee for this retreat but if a church would like to make a contribution to LLRA it certainly would be welcome.
